## WHAT TO BRING

One toy with one or two switches

- **Plush Toys** A toy with one on/off switch and an additional switch in the hand, foot or belly that you would squeeze to activate the toy is ideal. (examples: Tickle Me Elmo, Care Bears, dolls that talk or sing)
- **Action Figures** A toy with one on/off switch and/or a push button is ideal. (examples: Spiderman, Power Rangers, Robots)
- **Motor Vehicles** A remote toy with forward and reverse control, without controls moving left to right, are ideal. If the toy does not have a remote, choose one that does not go too fast. (examples: remote control race cars, Matchbox trucks, airplanes and helicopters)
- **Musical Toys** A toy with one on/off switch and/or a push button is ideal. It is best to avoid guitars, keyboards and multi-key or button instruments. (examples: crib toys, Sesame Street, musical)
